How to hold your pencil

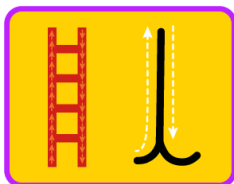
- Select [Resources > Warm up > Tripod Grip](#).

Spaces between words
