provision of small intervention groups to raise standards in literacy and numeracy skills	A significant number of pupils (including those who are EFSM) in the Y1 $-$ Y3 need further support to develop their knowledge of phonics. In Y3 $-$ Y6 identified pupils need support and intervention to develop their literacy and numeracy skills.

Activity	Evidence that supports this approach
focusing on well-being e.g. Talkabout, creative activities	Parents and staff indicate that a number of pupils require support for their mental well-being. Also a small number of pupils need intervention to develop their social skills to enable them to build stronger friendships.
Newport County, Gwent Dragons and UDOIT Dance	Pupil voice (girls and boys) has indicated that most pupils respond well to outside agencies and enjoy the learning experiences offered.
